All BFA1s who reside on campus must participate in at least a 10 meal plan offered by the café, but can always buy up to a higher meal plan. All BFA2s who reside on campus must purchase at least \$200.00 in flex each semester. Other students may also purchase a meal plan. In addition, a café debit flex account is a convenient way to pay for meals in the café. Since no tax is charged on food bought with a debit flex account, it also saves money. The Accounting Office handles meal plans and debit flex accounts. If you have any questions about the meal plan, please call the Student Accountant at 661.253.7847. Money can be added to a student's debit flex account by cash, check or credit card, and the minimum purchase is \$20.00. When mailing a check, please be sure to send it to the attention of the Accounting Office. If you are paying by credit card, call the cashier at 661.253.7846. CalArts accepts Discover, Visa, MasterCard and American Express.

CALARTS POLICY ON ALCOHOL & DRUGS

Both federal and state laws prohibit the unlawful possession or distribution of illicit drugs and alcohol. In the state of California, anyone under the age of 21 cannot be served or be in the possession of alcohol. The Institute also has standards that prohibit the unlawful possession, use, transport, manufacture or distribution of illicit drugs, drug paraphernalia or simulated drugs and alcohol by students, staff and faculty on Institute property or as part of the Institute's activities. Violations of this policy may lead to disciplinary sanctions, outlined in the Student Handbook and the Housing license agreement.

CalArts permits the lawful serving of alcohol beverages at parties and receptions that have been approved by the Institute. Alcohol must be served by an Institute-trained bartender who is responsible for checking identification and monitoring guests. Beer and wine are the only alcohol permitted and the Institute has set limits on the amounts to be served.

The calarts.edu website is managed by the Public Affairs Office, which is responsible for its design and content. Information available on the site includes: academic and admissions information, calendar of events, course catalogue, directories, general contact information, faculty bios, policies, and news and press releases. Additional web-based resources such as the library, academic services online (grades, class schedules, and financial aid offers), and specific department and academic program sites are accessible through the website. The site is best viewed using the latest versions of Mozilla Firefox, Safari, or Google Chrome.

FAMILY EDUCATION RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT OF 1974 (FERPA)

The Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (Buckley Amendment) is a federal law requiring the Institute to maintain the confidentiality of all “eligible students” education records. CalArts accords all rights under the law to students who are or have been registered. “Eligible student” is defined as one who has reached 18 years of age or is attending an institution of postsecondary education. When a student becomes an “eligible” student, the rights accorded to and consent required of parents transfer from the parent to the student.

Parental Access to Student Records

Educational records information may be released to a parent only if one of the following conditions has been met:

- 1) through the written consent of the student,
- 2) in compliance with a subpoena,
- 3) in connection with emergency health or safety issue,
- 4) by submission of evidence that the parents declare the student as a dependent on their most recent Federal Income Tax form.

The Act does not require CalArts to disclose information from the student’s education records to any parent of a dependent student. We may, however, exercise discretion to do so. We encourage you to view the Course Catalog and Academic Policies, 2010-2011. It is available at the CalArts website, www.calarts.edu. This publication will answer most of your questions regarding your student’s academic requirements.

The Financial Aid Office is located in F305 and is open from 9 am until 4 pm, Monday through Friday during the academic year. The telephone number is 661.253.7869, and the toll free number is 800.443.0480.

Financial aid information is on our website in early December. In order to be eligible for any type of aid through CalArts, a student must apply for financial aid using the Free Application for Federal Financial Aid (FAFSA) and submit the appropriate tax returns. It is very important to meet the established priority deadline, since campus-based funds are always limited and go first to those students who meet this deadline. California undergraduates resident students should apply for California State Scholarships. Forms and deadlines may change from year to year and it is important for students to check their campus mailboxes for the latest financial aid information. Applying for aid must be done each year and timely completion of all requirements will guarantee the most aid available.

Tuition covers only 59% of the actual cost of a CalArts education. Donations from a wide variety of sources, including parents and families, are essential to help enrich the student experience on campus and sustain the life-long benefits of a CalArts degree. HEALTH SERVICES

Health Services is staffed by a Registered Nurse who provides general care such as first aid for injuries, treatment for minor illnesses and consultation on health problems. Students are referred to physicians and/or nearby hospitals when necessary. The nurse will assist students regardless of whether or not they have purchased the CalArts student health insurance. If parents have concerns about the health of a student, do not hesitate to telephone the nurse at 661.253.7830. CalArts offers Anthem/Blue Cross student health insurance that must be purchased unless students have comparable alternative coverage. Enrolled students pay \$406 for the first semester, which covers September through December. The second semester payment is \$812, which covers January through August.

If your son or daughter brings a computer to CalArts and will be residing on campus, he or she can connect to the Internet through the CalArts network using an Ethernet jack and a Category 5e patch cable. Information regarding the equipment that students need to purchase is sent by the Housing Office. Wireless access points, as well as routers, are not permitted. Students should ask at the Help Desk in the Library if they need assistance connecting to the network. All computers connecting to the CalArts network must be free of viruses and patched with the latest security patches for their respective operating system before they can be connected. Un-patched or infected computers may be barred from the network. CalArts provides general use student computers in the Library as well as specialized workstations in the computer labs.

ON CAMPUS HOUSING

Living on campus is certainly an experience for all new students, and a challenging one. As a parent you are no doubt eager to help your son or daughter with housing arrangements. However, we encourage the student to be responsible for his or her own living situation. Information regarding present or future housing and billing is sent directly to the student, not to parents. On campus housing information is handled only through the Housing Office. When a student applies to live on campus, cancels his or her application, withdraws from school or takes a leave of absence, contact in regard to Housing must be handled through this office. Notice to any other office does not release a student of responsibility for a room or apartment on campus.

By the end of this academic year, your son or daughter is classified as a returning or continuing student. As a returning student, he or she is not required to live on campus. However, each student does have to submit a new housing agreement for each academic year if he/she would like to return to on campus housing. Returning student space is assigned usually around April 1 of each year. All returning students are advised of the specific date, six weeks prior to the sign-up. Applications for returning students are processed via lottery drawing. Just because one now lives on campus does not guarantee one a space for the following year.

Students will submit a new application and receive a lottery number. A completed housing application consists of four, filled-out forms and your housing deposit. It's important to note all applications must be turned in directly to the Housing Office and will not be accepted without the yellow receipt from the Accounting Office confirming your deposit payment. Applications turned in without a deposit (and without our immediate knowledge), will automatically be pulled from the Lottery after the deposit deadline. Actual date of that deadline and the date of the Housing Lottery is yet to be determined, as is the date for when the 2010/2011 housing application forms will be available to download. However, ample time will be given to afford all students an opportunity to prepare their paperwork. Ultimately, it is the student's responsibility to download all housing application forms from the CalArts website and turn in a fully completed housing application to the Housing Office on the upcoming specified deadline dates.

During the school year it is not unusual that a roommate dispute may arise or that a student may have a difficult time adjusting. The Housing Office encourages the student to discuss the situation with his/her Resident Assistant. RAs can help with disputes and conflicts and offer resolutions. If this does not work to everyone's satisfaction, the Housing Director will discuss the situation and try to work out an amicable agreement for all concerned. More serious problems, including alcohol or drug-related issues, may also be forwarded to the Dean of Students or a counselor. Housing works in conjunction with Student Affairs.

Since your son or daughter is now a registered college student and may have signed his or her own license agreement with Housing, there are certain conversations that may not occur between the Housing office and a parent. Please refer to the section of this handbook titled, "Family Education Rights and Privacy Act."

SECURITY (CAMPUS SAFETY)

Campus Safety staff are on duty at all times during the academic year. They are to be notified of any crime or incident committed on campus. Students are encouraged to file an incident report with Campus Safety in the event of theft, damage or vandalism to any personal property, physical or verbal assault, or any situation that causes concern to the student. Students may request an escort from the Campus Safety staff to accompany them to campus housing or the parking lot.

Dealing with Emergencies

CalArts uses the Connect-ED Emergency Notification System. This system notifies students and staff via text messaging and voice mail. The system can notify the entire student population of school closures and contingency plans, or late breaking developments. The Institute is committed to the safety and security of all members of the campus community. In times of emergency, the Institute will provide appropriate campus-wide response to assure life safety and minimize losses.

A Campus Emergency Procedures quick reference guide for efficient action has been distributed to all schools and departments. CalArts has an agreement with Ringling School of Art and Design in Sarasota, Florida wherein they act as an emergency response center for us. This means that if there is a disaster at CalArts, such as an earthquake, and persons are not able to contact CalArts, they can contact Ringling School for information about the CalArts emergency.

STUDENT AFFAIRS OFFICE

The Student Affairs Office offers a variety of services, activities and resources to assist students in managing their lives. The office coordinates in managing their lives. The office coordinates educational resources such as peer tutoring and services for students with disabilities, and the Dean of Students meets with students about complaints, problems and concerns. Two licensed counselors are available to work with students in a confidential setting, free of charge.

If you are worried about your student's welfare or progress at CalArts, call the Dean of Students, Yvonne Guy. She will make every effort to reach out to the student and provide the resources that may help. Since the privacy of college students, regardless of age, is protected under the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (also known as the Buckley Amendment), parents should recognize that they may not be given educational information about their sons or daughters, unless an emergency exists or the student allows for such information to be shared. However, any parent may speak with the Dean or one of the counselors to express concerns and ask for assistance for their son or daughter. The counselors are Linda Hoag and Melissa Shepherd.

STUDENT EVALUATIONS

Faculty assign grades at the end of each semester. Grades are available online via the CalArts Academic Services website, aar.calarts.edu. At CalArts academic/artistic credit for work completed is awarded in semester units. One semester unit is awarded on the basis of 45 hours of work during a semester. In order to receive credit in a class, a student must be registered at CalArts and enrolled in the class.

The quality of work performed is then recognized by award of the following evaluations:

HIGH PASS (HP) Passing with excellence

PASS (P) Passing with quality

LOW PASS (LP) Passing

STUDENT EVALUATIONS CONTINUED...

INCOMPLETE (I)

Temporary evaluation. Through agreement between student and instructor, Incompletes must be made up during the following semester. Incomplete evaluations not made up within the specified period of time will convert to "NC".

MULTIPLE (M)

Temporary evaluation assigned in the first semester of a two-semester sequence course. A final evaluation for both semesters of the sequence will be assigned at the end of the second semester.

NO CREDIT (NC)

Work did not meet the criteria for credit. "NC" evaluations may not be converted to credit bearing grades except by petition to the Deans Council initiated by the instructor of the class or, in the instructor's absence, the Dean of the school offering the course. "NC" evaluations do not appear on a student's permanent record for external purposes.

INSUFFICIENT ATTENDANCE (NX)

Indicates that the student did not attend the class with sufficient frequency. Assumes a minimum allowance of 3 unexcused absences. Refer to individual school handbook for specific policies. "NX" evaluations may not be converted to credit bearing grades. "NX" evaluations do not appear on a student's permanent record for external purposes.

NO GRADE RECORDED (NG)

Symbol assigned by automated process to indicate no evaluation was assigned by instructor. If a final grade is not received within one year after graduation or withdrawal from the Institute, the symbol will convert to "NC".

WITHDREW (W)

Given only when a student officially withdraws from the Institute during a semester.

CalArts does not use a Grade Point Average (GPA) as part of its marking system. However, for external purposes when a GPA is required, the following formula may be considered: HP=4.00, P=3.00, LP=2.00.

STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

CalArts is committed to Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, which mandate equal opportunity for qualified individuals in educational programs and activities. The Student Affairs Office provides assistance and resources to enable students with physical, perceptual, emotional, ADHD and learning disabilities to act independently while pursuing their educational goals. Registering with the Student Affairs Office is on a voluntary, self-identifying basis. Services are available only after a student has presented certified, current documentation of the disability from an appropriate medical or educational specialist, and this documentation has been reviewed and accepted as complete. Generally, the documentation should be based on an evaluation done within the past three years; an IEP from secondary school is not considered sufficient. After documentation is reviewed by the Dean of Students, the student must arrange to meet with the Dean to discuss his or her schedule for the semester and to make a plan for accommodating the disability. The request for services must be renewed each semester, since the student's schedule changes each term.

TEACHING AND LEARNING CENTER AND ACADEMIC ADVISING

The Teaching and Learning Center (TLC) provides a range of services to help students succeed in all aspects of their CalArts education. Students who are having difficulty progressing through their program or their Critical Studies courses may contact the TLC through the Student Affairs office or via email at mbryant@calarts.edu. The Center offers resources for students with learning differences, as well as counseling for students on academic warning, and tutoring for English as a Second Language, music skills and theory classes, written communication, and other CalArts courses. The TLC is located in the Library.

Academic advisors compliment the guidance students receive from their mentors. Academic advisement is a collaborative relationship between the student and an advisor. Advisors work with students to identify their academic goals, develop the skills needed to obtain those goals and guide students through the requirements of their degree. Advising is a process that helps students to approach their degree in a holistic and organized way. Students can expect an atmosphere of guidance, support, and encouragement from their advisor. Advisement services are provided by Patty Lopez (plopez@calarts.edu), the Institute Academic Advisor housed in the Office of the Registrar, and by Mike Bryant (mbryant@calarts.edu) in the Teaching and Learning Center in the Library.
